"The Journey in a Day"

We’ve been taking a journey through the gospel of John. A journey of faith. A journey we are all on, yet it is different for each of us. For some, that journey began with our parents. We were passengers as they led us to know Jesus. But eventually they had to let us out of the car and the journey had to become ours. For others, the journey began later in life after tasting of the world’s pleasures and desires you were somehow led to know Jesus as well. For some, their faith is deep, strong and resilient. For others, they struggle with doubts and questions. It doesn’t matter how you started the journey, just that you finish.

In John 9, we see this journey in almost warp speed. You know the story. Jesus heals a man born blind. Then the man is mercilessly interrogated and questioned by the leaders of the Jews. During these intense encounters, we see this man’s faith grow by leaps and bounds. At first, He is relying on others testimony about who healed him. In verse 11 he replies to their questions by saying, *“The man they call Jesus”* had healed him. A while later he states that *“He is a prophet”* in regard to their questions about Jesus. Later, after even more scrutiny he says, *“If this man were not from God, he could do nothing”*. How far he has come: From a man, to a prophet, to one from God. And yet he still had further to go.

Jesus hears that the man has been put out of the synagogue, sought him out and found him. *“Do you believe in the Son of Man?”*, Jesus asked him. He replied *“Who is He , sir? Tell me so that I may believe in Him.”* Jesus says, *“You have now seen Him; in fact, He is the one speaking to you.”* The man then said, *“Lord, I believe,” and he worshipped Him.*

When we come to Jesus, we will be confronted by this world. We’ll be questioned and interrogated and persecuted. We will either buckle under the pressure or be strengthened in our resolve. May we be like the formerly blind man and stand resolute in our faith.


