It was a defining moment. It was perhaps the greatest of all Jesus' miracles. Raising a man from the dead who had been in the tomb four days. It was unheard of, unprecedented and quite frankly unbelievable. And yet, there before their eyes stood Lazarus at the entrance to the tomb: Alive and walking! Can you imagine the gasps? Maybe some fainted. But all had to be both amazed and terrified at the same time.

In the midst of all this excitement, Jesus recognizes a need. Lazarus was still wrapped in the linen strips used to bury him. He says, "Take off his grave clothes". Lazarus was alive. He wasn't meant to stagger around like a mummy or a zombie. He was meant to regain his life and live it to the fullest. The next time we hear of Lazarus, he is sitting and eating with Jesus.

Paul reminds us that we all at one time were dead in our sins. He also tells us that through Jesus Christ we have been made alive. But, like Lazarus, we should no longer be clothed in our grave clothes. In Colossians 3, he tells us to "rid ourselves" of things such as anger, rage and filthy language. He goes on to say, "take off your old self with its practices".

He goes on to say, "clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience". And, "over all these things put on love, which binds them all together in perfect unity".

Like Lazarus, since we have been made alive, we should no longer walk around as a mummy or zombie. We should take off our grave clothes and put on the clothes of life to the full.
