## "Taking Jesus Into Your Boat"

It had been a long day. Jesus had wanted to have some alone time. He had just learned of the beheading of John the Baptist and wanted to spend time in prayer and meditation. However, the crowds followed Him to the other side of the lake. He taught them and fed them. He then told the disciples to take a boat and return across the lake while He dismissed the crowd. After dismissing the crowd, He finally had the time to Himself he needed.

Meanwhile, as the disciples were crossing the lake, the winds and waves grew rough and they were straining at the oars and it was the middle of the night. As they looked out, they saw a strange figure walking on the water and it says they were terrified. I completely understand their fear. That would have freaked me out too! Jesus says to them, "It is I, do not be afraid." And then it says, "Then they were willing to take Him into the boat".

The phrase that struck me was "they were willing". This stands in contrast to the reaction of the town's people when Jesus healed the demon-possessed man (Mark 5). Even though they saw the great thing Jesus had done; even though Jesus did what they could not; even though they saw the man, "dressed and in his right mind", when they were afraid, they asked Jesus to leave.

There will be times when we are afraid. When the winds and waves grow rough. It is those times when we need to be willing to take Jesus into our boat, so to speak. He won't force Himself into our boat. He is always there. Always waiting. But we must be willing. So, will we, like the disciples, take Jesus into our boat?
